Michael Louis Kern, 74, of Marietta, Ohio, died Wednesday, November 18, 2020 at Marietta Memorial Hospital. He was born on October 24, 1946 in Marietta to the late Ambrose R. and Dorothy Beardmore Kern.

Mike was a 1964 graduate of St. Mary's Catholic High School, and with 12 years of night school at Marietta College, taking classes in business law, math and accounting, earning a degree in chemical engineering.
